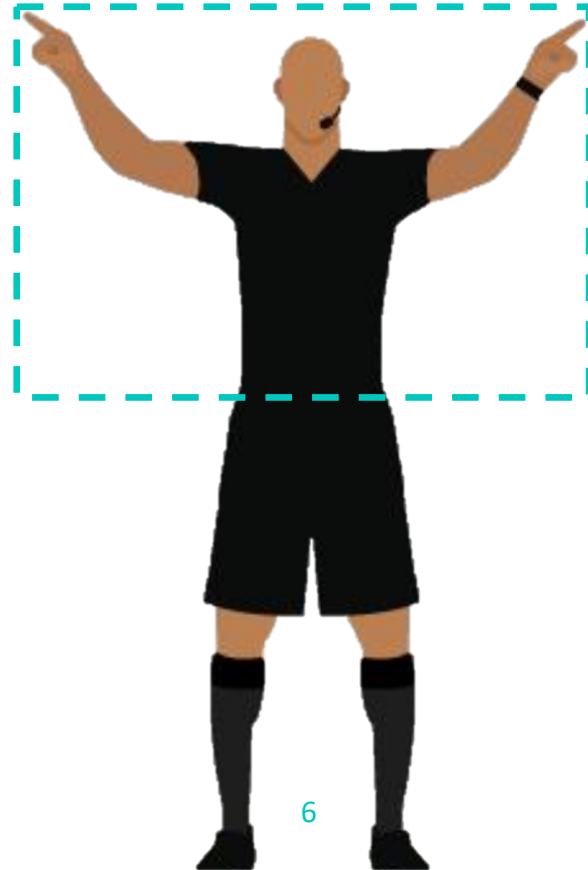

4. FILMING OF THE MATCHES

Any teams/team members found to be recording matches will be breaking IFF rules, and will risk having their accreditation taken away as well as having monetary fines imposed upon them and their Association.

5. REFEREE INSTRUCTIONS

Referee management: Mattias Linell, Head of Referees

Fluency and floating game

- Avoid long breaks or interruptions
- Strict against any incorrect waste of time
- Use advantage to promote a floating game

Communication

- In the game = needed amount but not breaking the game fluency
- During intermissions = only in the corridors, not on the field of play
- After the game = willingness to discuss & develop the sport together with the teams

REFEREE INSTRUCTIONS (cont.)

Strict towards

- Physical / verbal abuse – from anyone towards anyone
- Tackles / physical offences to head, knees or when a player has no possibility/intention to play the ball in accordance with the IFF physical play guidelines
- All offences “after the situation” or “off-the-ball”
- Misconduct of all kinds

New rules

- A player is allowed to intentionally kick the ball more than once
- After a delayed penalty when offending team controlled the ball, play is resumed with a free hit
- 2+2-minute penalty replaces the 5-minute penalty
- Match penalty if a player leaves the substitution zone and participates in an altercation
- All match penalties except Technical match penalty -> 1 game automatic suspension

REFEREE INSTRUCTIONS (cont.)

Behaviour towards the referees

The IFF expects players & team officials to show respect to the referees at all times. No shouting at the referees during or after the game. If something needs to be discussed with the referees (and the referees feel it is appropriate), then it can be done during the intermissions or after the game, and away from the rink.

Any abuse of the referees will be harshly dealt with by the Event Disciplinary Function.

Referee management

Referee management are in the arena during and after each game.

The list of daily referee appointments is available from the match secretariat each morning

10. ACCREDITATION



Accreditation cards must be always worn AROUND THE NECK when in the venue area with the picture side easily visible.

Exception is granted to players before, during and after their match, but only in locker rooms, corridors next to locker rooms and rink.

Team officials and others have to wear the accreditation at all times.

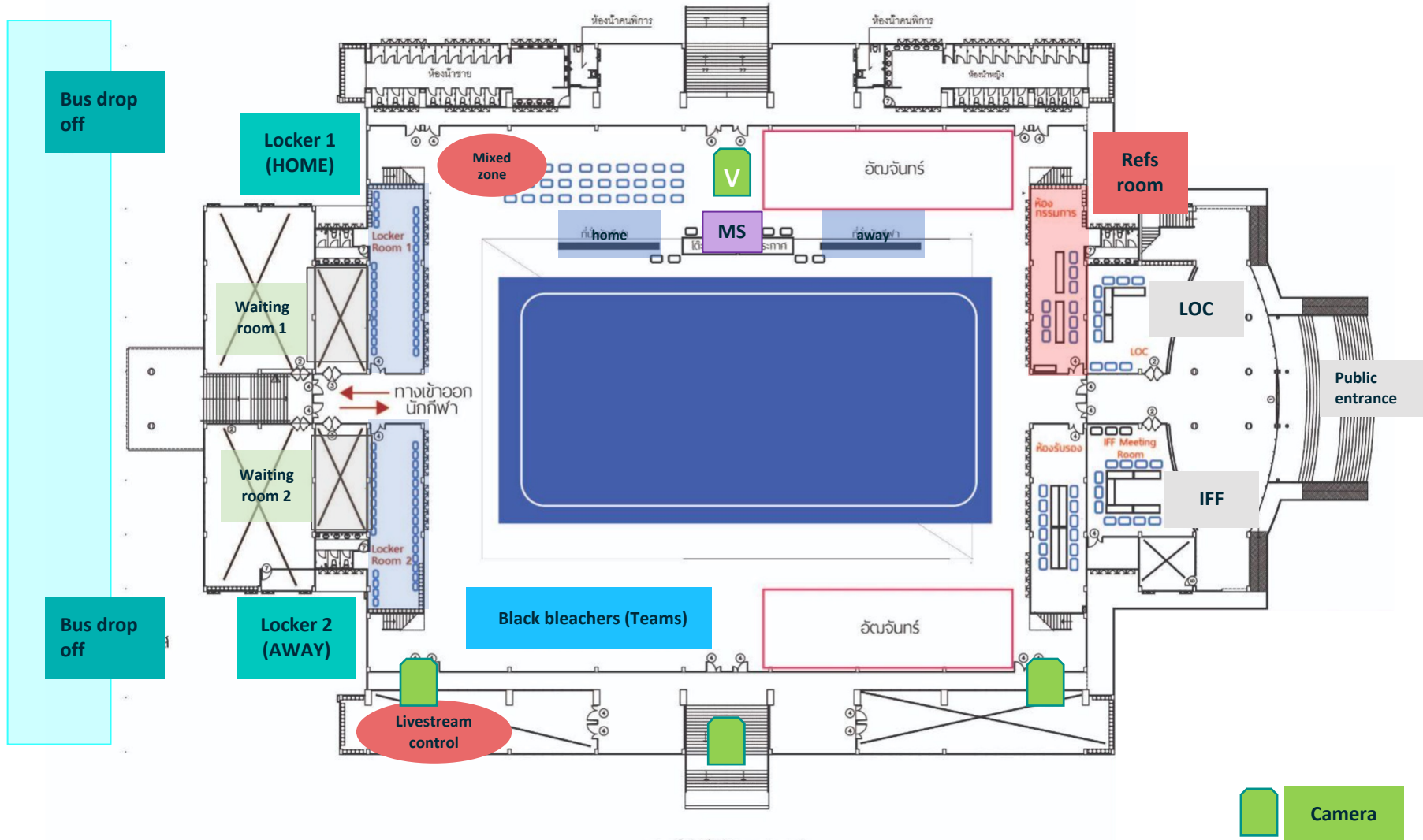

ARENA : VENUE PLAN

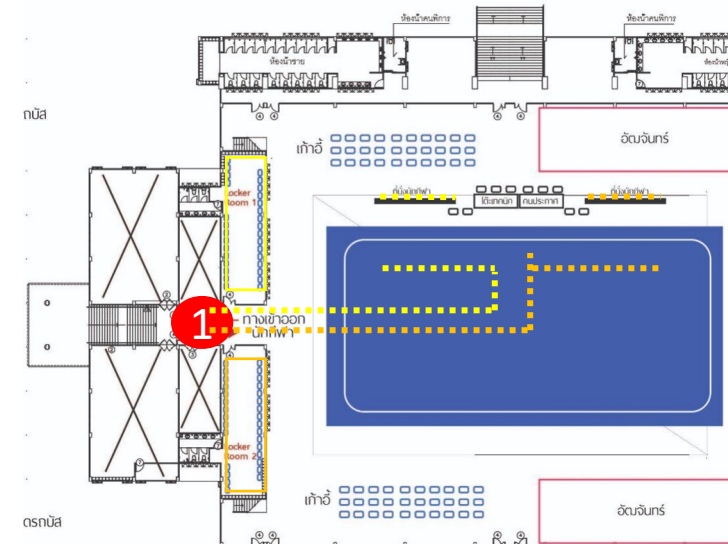


12. CEREMONIES



TIME SCHEDULE BEFORE THE MATCH

Time to go before match starts	What to do
~0 : 45	Warm-up starts after the previous match ends. Note that the teams must leave the playing area before the warm-up can begin.
0 : 15	End of the warm-up (signal given by Match Secretariat)
0 : 08	Teams are ready at the team entrance, captains in front, with players lined up behind them in number order (lowest to highest)
0 : 07	Both teams enter the rink (<i>walking enter down the middle and break at the middle, same time</i>) and line-up in the centre of the court facing the main TV camera. The referees will enter the court from the match secretariat after the teams have arrived and stand between them, also facing the main TV camera.
0 : 06	<i>Flag bearer will move to a spot in front of the team</i> National anthems are played (Away team first)
0 : 03	Quick warm-up and final team preparations
0 : 02	Starting Line-ups are announced. Away team first, starting with GK, then defenders, centre & forwards. Referees are announced.
0 : 00	The Match will start

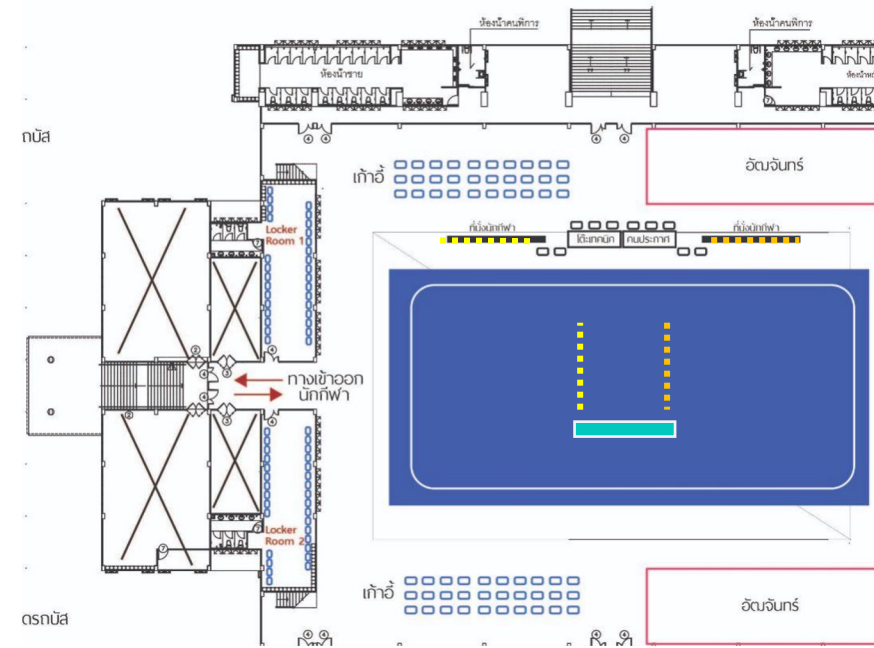


12. CEREMONIES



TIME SCHEDULE AFTER THE MATCH

Time after match ends	What to do
+0 : 01	Teams take position facing each other
+0 : 02	The LOC will award the “Player of the match” from each team. The chosen players will be requested by the match speaker to step forward to receive the prize. They stay for a joint photo and then return to their line.
+0 : 03	The teams thank each other and immediately leave the court through the Mixed Zone. NO COOLING DOWN ON COURT.
	DUE TO THE LIMIT IN THE NUMBER OF LOCKERS, WE ASK TEAMS TO PROMPTLY LEAVE THE LOCKER ROOM NOT MORE THAN 15 MINS AFTER THE GAME



13. SPECIAL ISSUES



INTERMISSIONS DURING MATCH PERIODS

Intermission in all matches will be 10 minutes.

QUALIFICATION

The top 2 placed teams qualify to the Women 's WFC 2023 final round

COMPRESSION WEAR

Any visible parts of undershirts, undershorts, tights and compression wear shall be of the same colour as the main colour of the match uniform shirt or the shorts. For leg wear black is also allowed. Any incorrect colours will be penalised by the referees according to the IFF Rules of the Game 605.23 (2 minutes Bench penalty).

15. COVID-19 PROTOCOLS



COVID REGULATIONS

Masks are not mandatory, but are encouraged, especially if you go to local areas.

SUSPECTED INFECTIONS

If any of your team delegation show symptoms of a respiratory illness, they should immediately be isolated and should take a rapid antigen test. Tests are available at any 7-11 or pharmacy for less than 1 US per test.

If the test returns a positive result the player should remain in isolation and a PCR test should be arranged with the LOC to confirm the result. All other team members should take a rapid antigen test.

Please inform the LOC & IFF immediately of any positive test results

Rule clarification

- **If the ball hits a player or a member of the team staff leaning over the board**
 - **Player → Minor penalty - Too many players on the rink**
 - **Team staff -> Minor penalty - Incorrect coaching**

- **If a player or a member of the team staff takes part or tries to take part in play (intentionally playing) from the substitution zone**
-> **Match penalty – Sabotage of play**

Expectations

- **Show energy and commitment on and off the rink**
- **Lead from the front – Act, don't just react**
- **“Work with the small things”**
- **Set the frame with understandable penalties**
- **Be honest and clear in your feedback talks – Speak up**
- **Ask me questions if I'm not making myself clear**
- **Look at games and discuss them**
- **Have fun**
